Conversely, a combustible gas, such as acetylene, may be safely carburetted by these hydrocarbons in a properly constructed apparatus set up outside the dwellinghouse, as explained in Chapter IX., because there would be no air (as in air-gas) in the pipes, iVc., and a larger escape of carburetted acetylene than of air-gas would be required to produce an explosive atmosphere in a room. Moreover, the odour of the acetylene itself would render the detection of a leak far easier with carburetted acetylene than with air-gas. 1 The nomenclature of the different volatile spirits is apt to be very confusing. Benzene is the proper name for the most volatile hydrocarbon derived from coal-tar,...
